### The Winter Show Announces Exhibitors and Design Council Co-Chairs for the 2026 Edition

**New York, NY** (September 16th, 2025) - The Winter Show has unveiled the exhibitor lineup for its 72nd edition, returning to the historic Park Avenue Armory from January 23 through February 1, 2026. The Fair will open with its celebrated Opening Night Preview benefit for East Side House on January 22nd. This year's edition brings together more than 70 leading international dealers, presenting museum-quality works spanning fine and decorative arts, antiques, jewelry, and design. Alongside the exhibitions, The Winter Show will present a dynamic program of special events and collaborations with world-renowned institutions, cultural organizations, and influential voices in art and design.

Established in 1954 by East Side House Settlement, The Winter Show is a landmark New York event that has raised vital funds for the visionary community-based organization for over 70 years. Proceeds from ticket sales and benefit events—including the Opening Night Preview on January 22nd and Young Collectors Night on January 29th—directly support East Side House's educational, workforce, and supportive programs that serve the Bronx and Northern Manhattan.

Since the inception of The Winter Show, East Side House has worked hand in hand to uplift thousands of New Yorkers," said Daniel Diaz, Executive Director of East Side House Settlement. "In 2026, we will continue to build on the momentum of opening the Bronx's first innovative healthcare-focused CTE charter high school, while advancing transformative capital projects that will shape the borough's future. These initiatives are not just infrastructure; they are investments in opportunity. With The Winter Show's support, we are laying stronger foundations for generations to come."

“For 72 years, The Winter Show has been a beacon of excellence, presenting museum-quality works that inspire and engage,” said Helen Allen, Executive Director of The Winter Show. “But the Show’s purpose reaches far beyond the Armory. At its core, it is about supporting East Side House and advancing its vital work in empowering communities through education and opportunity.”

### **New and Returning International Exhibitors**

The Winter Show is excited to announce several new exhibitors joining this year's edition from the United States and Europe, including **Galerie Cahn** (Basel, Switzerland) specializing in Ancient Greek, Etruscan and Roman art; **Gallery 19C** (Dallas/Fort Worth, Texas) focusing exclusively on 19th Century works; **Greg Pepin Silver** (Copenhagen, Denmark) with expertise in Georg Jensen silver; **Graf, Kaplan & Zemaitis** (Mendham, New Jersey) exhibiting decorative arts and crafts through the 1970s; **Rose Uniacke** (London, England) dealing 17<sup>th</sup> to 20<sup>th</sup> Century design and decorative arts and **Symbolic & Chase** (London) presenting fine jewelry and objet's d'art . Also rejoining the roster are Bowman (London) specializing in 19<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> Century sculpture and Geoffrey Diner (Washington D.C.) presenting post-war American masterworks.

Returning New York exhibitors with more than 40 years at the fair include: A La Vieille Russie, renowned authorities in antique European jewelry and Fabergé; Hirschl & Adler, specialists in American and European paintings, watercolors, drawings, and sculpture from the eighteenth through early twentieth centuries; Joan B. Mirviss, the leading Western dealer in Japanese modern and contemporary ceramics; Ralph M. Chait Galleries, the nation's oldest gallery devoted to fine Chinese porcelain and works of art; James Robinson Inc. specializing in antique jewelry and glass; SJ Shrubsole experts in rare and exceptional pieces of antique English, Irish, Scottish, and American silver; and The Old Print Shop, distinguished for its expertise in American graphic arts, antiquarian maps, atlases, and artist books.

“This year’s Show will present “**The Discerning Eye: Study of a Young Collector**,” an immersive installation featuring works from a roster of “next gen” international dealers that recreates the private study of a imaginary collector, inviting visitors into a world where taste, curiosity, and imagination converge. Curated by art advisor and writer Patrick Monahan with Helen Allen.

### **Design Council Co-Chairs**

Each year, in celebration of the design community, The Winter Show invites leading figures from the fields of interior design and architecture to helm the Show as Design Co-Chairs. The esteemed 2026 Design Council Co-Chairs are **Heidi Caillier, Noz Nozawa, Ben Pentreath, Jane Keltner de Valle, and Giancarlo Valle**. In addition to raising awareness of the vital work being done by East Side House, the Design Co-Chairs provide contemporary context and promote the appreciation and use of historic art and objects in contemporary architecture and design.

## **Background**

The Winter Show is the longest-running art, antiques, and design fair in the United States. Since 1954, it has served as the annual benefit for East Side House Settlement, a community-based organization supporting the Bronx and Northern Manhattan. Beyond its fundraising mission, the Show is a centerpiece of New York City's cultural and social calendar.

The 2026 edition will feature more than 70 exhibitors presenting an extraordinary range of works, from paintings, sculpture, and works on paper to fine furniture, jewelry, silver, rare books, and contemporary ceramics and glass. Upholding the highest standards in the art market, every object is rigorously vetted by over 120 specialists across 30 disciplines for authenticity, condition, provenance, and significance, ensuring both excellence and transparency for collectors.

All general admission revenue and net proceeds from the Opening Night Preview and related events directly support East Side House's vital community programs. No portion of exhibitor sales benefits East Side House. The Winter Show takes place at the Park Avenue Armory, 67th Street and Park Avenue, New York City.

### **Design Council Co-Chairs**

**Heidi Caillier** is an AD100 interior designer based in Seattle, renowned for creating timeless, emotionally resonant spaces that blend vintage charm with modern sophistication. After launching her design career through the blog *The Rustic Modernist*, she founded *Heidi Caillier Design* in 2014, quickly gaining recognition for her distinctive aesthetic that embraces rich patterns, moody color palettes, and a curated mix of antiques and artisanal pieces. Her work spans high-end residential and hospitality projects across the U.S., including notable transformations in the Hamptons and Hudson Valley. In 2023, she published her debut book, *Memories of Home*, which showcases twelve of her most evocative projects and reflects her philosophy that a home should feel lived-in, layered, and full of personal history.

**Noz Nozawa** is the founder and principal designer of Noz Design, a San Francisco–based interior design firm renowned for its eclectic, narrative-driven spaces that seamlessly blend luxury finds with flea market treasures, natural materials with cutting-edge technology, and pops of color and texture. Established in 2014 after Nozawa transitioned from a successful marketing career, the firm has garnered recognition from Architectural Digest, Luxe Magazine, Elle Decor, and House Beautiful, and has cultivated a loyal following for its ability to craft not just beautiful spaces, but those that spark joy and inspire conversation.

**Ben Pentreath** is a British architectural and interior designer celebrated for blending traditional and contemporary styles. Since founding Ben Pentreath Ltd in 2004, he is known for creating timeless spaces inspired by 18th- and 19th-century English interiors, interpreted with modern sensibility. His projects range from private homes to urban developments and public commissions, including major work at Poundbury, the Duchy of Cornwall's urban extension of Dorchester. In 2023, he received the Richard H. Driehaus Prize for his contributions to classical architecture and urbanism. Pentreath is also the author of *English Decoration* and *An English Vision*, and co-owner of Pentreath & Hall, a London shop offering distinctive home furnishings.

**Jane Keltner de Valle and Giancarlo Valle** and their partnership, Studio Valle de Valle is an award-winning international design practice dedicated to creating spaces that are playful, studied, and unexpected. The studio's holistic approach encompasses architecture, interiors, and the decorative arts, across residential and hospitality, from thoughtful refinement to total reimagination. In 2024, the couple opened Casa Valle, an immersive design gallery in Tribeca. The space serves as an extension of their

home and design practice, bringing together the Giancarlo Valle furniture and lighting collection with historic designs in one holistic environment. Giancarlo is an architect and grew up between San Francisco, Chicago, Caracas, and Guatemala City, and received his Masters of Architecture from Princeton University. Jane is a veteran editor and the former style director at Architectural Digest. She grew up in New York City and received a bachelor's in literature and art history from Barnard College, Columbia University.
